1. Introduction

It outlines the rules, regulations, and procedures essential for ensuring a smooth and fair competition. Here you will be provided with the necessary information to help you understand your responsibilities and the expectations set for the tournament.

This handbook, together with the applicable event manuals, applies to all participants and any other entities associated with them who wish to take part in TTCup.com tournaments.

1.1. Goals and Objectives

This Tournament showcases the skill, precision, and sportsmanship of talented players from around the world. We are excited to provide a platform for both professional and emerging players to compete in a fair and competitive environment.

The tournament aims to:

- to popularize table tennis all over the world;
- to promote table tennis at the local and regional levels and give to the players extra experience on international table tennis;
- to increase the impact of table tennis as a tool for social development all over the world;
- to assist table tennis players to further improve their skills and techniques and become more professional;
- to prepare the athletes of national teams from different country to the national and international tournaments, World Table Tennis Championships, European Championships, Olympic Games and so on;

- to involve new players and provide them with consistent match practices;
- endeavour to increase participation at all levels;
- foster friendly sporting competition and eliminate unfair and unsporting practices, such as match manipulation;
- to support the principles of fair play in all activities related to the table tennis tournaments.

Our goal is to create an environment where skill, sportsmanship, and fair play are celebrated. We encourage all participants to familiarize themselves with the contents of this handbook to ensure a positive and successful experience for everyone involved. We wish you the best of luck as you embark on this exciting journey in the world of table tennis!

1.2. Structure

- This handbook outlines a framework of essential standards and guidelines that govern the intention to participate in or actual participation in the tournament.
- It serves as the foundation for all activities related to the championship, outlining the governing principles, responsibilities, and regulations for all involved parties.
- The Officials (Tournament Committee) shall have final authority over all decisions related to the event, including the interpretation of rules, handling disputes, and issuing sanctions for any violations.
- The Officials reserves the right to amend this Handbook as necessary to adapt to evolving needs, ensuring fairness and alignment with the highest standards of the sport; shall be updated online on the official website at: <https://ttcup.com>.
- By entering and/or participating in TTCup.com tournaments all participants acknowledge and agree that they shall comply with the rules, regulations, and any additional requirements and procedures as described in this handbook and any other official TTCup.com documents and emails and shall remain primarily liable to TTCup.com for any non-compliance therewithin.

- All TTCup.com tournaments are conducted in compliance with the official rules and regulations of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) to ensure a fair, professional, and standardized environment for all participants. Except as amended otherwise by this handbook or other official documents.
- This Handbook can be tailored and expanded as necessary, but it serves as a solid foundation for outlining the purpose, rules, and structure of the tournament. It will ensure that all participants and officials are clear on their responsibilities and the overall objectives of the tournaments.
- If any provision in the Handbook is held to be invalid, unenforceable or illegal for any reason, it shall be deemed to be deleted and the remainder of the Handbook shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.
- The provisions in the Handbook shall be interpreted in a manner that protects and advances their respective purposes. If any matter arises that is not addressed in any part of the Statutes or any ambiguity arises, it shall be addressed objectively in a purposive manner.

1.3. Privacy Policy

The Table Tennis Cup respects privacy. We are committed to ensuring the protection and security of personal data. This Privacy Policy explains the types of personal data we collect, the purposes for collecting it, how personal data is processed, as well as the rights in relation to personal data.

When you interact with us, we collect your personal data. To ensure the protection of your personal data, we define it as any information that can directly or indirectly identify you. The personal data that we collect from each player are the following, but not limited to:

- Name
- Last name
- Date of birth
- Place of residence
- Photo

- Results of tournaments and match statistics
- Video of matches (broadcasting)
- Payment details (such as credit card information)

The collection of the above categories of personal data is carried out in accordance with applicable data protection laws.

Why do we collect your personal data?

We collect your personal data to provide our website and social media (YouTube, Instagram etc). The objectives are the following, but not limited to:

- to process your registration and manage your participation in the tournament;
- publication of competition protocols/schedule;
- coverage of tournament results;
- coverage photos and videos in social media and betting platforms;
- distribution videos for commercial purpose;
- the processing of competition results;
- the publication of ranking.

How do we process personal data?

We process personal data in accordance with the following principles at all times:

- **Legality.** When processing personal data, we always ensure that the processing is carried out in accordance with applicable laws.
- **Transparency.** When collecting personal data, we endeavor to provide you with as much information as possible about the processing of your personal data.
- **Limitation of purpose.** Personal data is collected for specific, explicit and legitimate purposes and is not processed in a manner incompatible with the original purpose of collection.
- **Data minimization.** We only collect and/or process data that is strictly necessary for our personal data processing activities.
- **Storage limitation.** We do not retain personal data for longer than necessary.
- **Integrity and confidentiality.**

How long do we keep your personal data?

We do not keep personal data for longer than it is necessary. When keeping personal data, we take into account legal obligations and the original purpose of collection. The retention period of personal data is only for the time required for processing its purpose in conjunction with the legislation in force.

2. Regulations

These regulations govern the conduct of regular international table tennis tournaments under the supervision of the Table Tennis Cup (TTcup.com). These regulations ensure the smooth and fair conduct of international table tennis tournaments while maintaining the integrity of the sport.

- The regulations apply to all participating players, officials, and organizing bodies.
- The tournament must adhere to the ITTF Laws of Table Tennis and relevant competition rules.
- The regulations are applied in all Table Tennis tournaments unless specified otherwise in any other relevant documents.

2.1. Location and venue

The tournaments of TTCup.com are international and situated in:

- 2.1.1. Poland
- 2.1.2. Czech Republic
- 2.1.3. Spain
- 2.1.4. Estonia
- 2.1.5. USA

Facilities include multiple competition courts, warm-up areas, place for staying and lounge zone. The quantity of courts shall be up to:

- Poland: two (2) courts;
- Czech Republic: three (3) courts;
- Spain: one (1) court;
- Estonia: one (1) court;
- USA: two (courts).

2.2. Tournaments format

The tournaments may feature the following categories:

- Men's Singles
- Women's Singles

Singles events follow a Round Robin format (followed by an elimination stage) + final matches. That means each player plays against every other participant in their group and shall gain 2 match points for a win, 1 for a loss in a played match and 0 for a loss in an unplayed or unfinished match; Players will be drawn in groups based on their level and rank.

Playing format according to the country:

- Poland: Round Robin out of 4/5/6 players + 3rd and 1st place matches (for 4/5 players in group) or 5th, 3rd and 1st place matches (for 6 players);
- Czech Republic: Round Robin out of 4 players + 3rd and 1st place matches;

- Spain: Round Robin out of 4 or 5 players + 3rd and 1st place matches;
- Estonia: Round Robin out of 4 players + 3rd and 1st place matches;
- USA: Round Robin out of 4 players + 3rd and 1st place matches.

The best-of-five games format is used only. A match is won by the player who first wins the required number of games - 3 out of 5.

A game shall be won by the player first scoring 11 points unless both players score 10 points, when the game shall be won by the first player subsequently gaining a lead of 2 points.

The order of play is finalized as:

2.3. Equipment and conditions

The playing and technical equipment (table, net assembly, balls, racket covering, floor) used in Table Tennis Cup tournaments shall comply with the relevant requirements and specifications, so approved and authorised equipment by ITTF.

Tables: DHS Golden Rainbow LED (black top)

Nets: DHS black net

Balls: DHS, Xiom, Joola, Butterfly

The playing area meets standards, including adequate lighting, flooring, and barriers. Rackets must conform to ITTF regulations regarding rubber, blade, and color. Proper ventilation and temperature control are ensured to provide optimal playing conditions.

2.4. Schedule

The schedule for regular Table Tennis Cup tournaments is designed to ensure smooth operations and proper time management for all participants. There is a permanent schedule organised for each venue, so in the general form the tournaments are held full day. The general tournaments schedule and any changes will be published on the official tournament website for easy access by players, officials, and spectators: <https://ttcup.com>.

- According to the schedule, matches take place every 30 minutes;
- there is 20 minutes break before final matches;
- in case of unforeseen delays, the schedule may be adjusted accordingly;
- in case of technical delays alternative plans and rescheduling will be determined by the tournament manager; 12
- in case of player withdrawals, the schedule will be updated accordingly to ensure fairness;
- the schedules are published every evening for the next day's matches;
- the result of every match updates immediately on the website, including points score.

3. Rules and Code of Conduct

3.1. Eligibility & Participation

- Here is established the following eligibility regulations to ensure fair competition and maintain the integrity of the game:
- the legal age of participation is above the age of 18; players must provide valid identification for age verification;
- it's a big advantage if the player is registered with the official governing body (e.g. national table tennis association, local federation, ITTF);
- in case the player is not a member of federation/association, has to provide some recommendations from the official table tennis body;
- who has an adequate level of training; participated some local tournaments and have a results that can prove the level of skills;
- qualification may be based on previous tournament performance, national rankings, or invitation by the organizing committee;
- players have to disclose their level of professional training and skills upon registration;
- players have to be medically fit to participate and may be required to submit a health clearance form;
- who are familiarize with terms and conditions of Table Tennis Cup tournaments and accept it; players must comply with the tournament's code of conduct and sportsmanship policies;
- no player shall be eligible if he/she is under suspicious or disqualified by ITTF, regional federation, local table tennis association etc;
- no player shall be eligible if he/she has been already disqualified by Table Tennis Cup before;
- candidate will not be considered if he/she has a bad reputation, legal problems, suspicion of cheating in any kind of sport or match fixing;
- it's not possible to participate if the player just a fan of table tennis and want to try himself/herself in tournaments;
- the tournament organizers reserve the right to withdraw a player if they are deemed unfit to compete.

3.2. General rules

- All parties of TTCup.com tournaments shall be aware of the importance of their duties and concomitant obligations and responsibilities.
- **Players entry:**
 - once a player has been approved to participate in a tournament, he must provide the requested information;
 - an agreement to accept the terms and conditions must be signed;
 - by registering for the tournament, players consent to the collection, processing, and storage of their personal data for the purposes of tournament management and communication;
 - by participating in the tournament, the player automatically consents to the use of his/her personal data;
 - lack of knowledge of the rules does not absolve one from responsibility;
 - register and complete Table Tennis Integrity Training and provide the certificate you will get after;
 - player will be informed of his match schedule in advance;
 - player must arrive at the venue at least 30 minutes before his first match is scheduled;
 - players are responsible for keeping themselves informed when to play and shall be ready to play when their matches are scheduled;
 - any player failing to appear for a match within the allocated time may be disqualified from the tournament and sanctioned;
 - player who wish to withdraw must notify the organizers at least 12 hours before the tournament starts.

Clothing:

- player's outfit must comply with table tennis clothing;
- the white color (dominant) is prohibited to be used on TTCup.com tournaments;
- the shirt must be short-sleeved (the shoulders is covered);
- clothing must not feature any designs or text that could be considered offensive or disrespectful to the sport/tournament/opponent, referee;

- there shouldn't be elements of player's clothing that can be excessively bright or reflective in a way that could obstruct an opponent's or referee's vision;
- if there is a player name on the back of shirt, it must accurately represent the player wearing it and not someone else;
- opposing players should wear shirts that are sufficiently different colors to enable them to be easily distinguished;
- player must bring at least two shirts of different colors for attending the tournament;
- shoes have to be designed for table tennis (not high top basketball, football etc).

Behaviour:

- players should always demonstrate respect toward opponents, referees, officials, and spectators;
- players must accept the decisions of referees and umpires without argument or confrontation;
- players must remain composed and avoid aggressive or disruptive behavior, such as shouting, throwing equipment, or hitting the table;
- any damage to tournament property due to misconduct will be the player's responsibility including compensation for damage caused;
- time-wasting tactics, unnecessary delays, or unsportsmanlike gestures are not allowed;
- it's prohibited for player to leave the playing area without the referee's permission;
- proper warm-up and match readiness are expected;
- do not interfere with other ongoing matches or make excessive noise;
- a commitment to rejecting all forms of harassment, whether physical, professional, or sexual; as well as any actions that may cause physical or mental harm;
- any violations of the above behavioral expectations may result in warnings, penalties, match forfeits, or disqualification from the tournament;
- repeated offenses may lead to disqualification forever.

Important:

- there are no viewers/visitors during the tournaments at the venue;
- the players have to play at full strength and fight for every point;
- it's prohibited to play match-fixing;
- never betting or gambling (any kind of sport);
- it's prohibited to use mobile phones, smart watches, headphones or any electronic devices during the matches;
- correct player placements (at the beginning of match) from referee's point of view are:
 - Player 1/Home - on right side
 - Player 2/Away - on left side;
- always play hard and perform to the best of your abilities, another way the referee/organizers can stop the match and disqualify for bad performance.

Organising conditions:

The organizer is responsible for preparing the hall, equipment, reception of the players and any conditions for comfortable staying.

The organizer is responsible to provide the referees and administrators for the tournament, who help to keep order and hold the tournament due to the rules.

If there are any suspicions about fair play the organizer has a right to stop the match / to cancel the match / to annul the score / to disqualify the player. In this case there will be an investigation, due diligence to identify and prove the fraud.

3.3 Referee role

The Referee - is the main person on court during the shift who keeps things in order and takes care about the normal conditions for covering matches; who has to make a correct decision in a moment. So the referee must be very attentive during the matches and cover them due to the rules of table tennis.

The referee plays a crucial role in ensuring the tournament runs smoothly, fairly, and in accordance with established rules. Below is a breakdown of the referee's responsibilities:

- referee is responsible for ensuring all players follow the ITTF rules of table tennis and any specific tournament rules;
- referee must check that the table, equipment, and attire comply with the required standards before the match starts;
- ensuring that only authorised persons are at the playing area;
- referee must ensure that the match is conducted in a fair and orderly manner;
- the referee follows the schedule and makes sure that all matches begin on time;
- referee is responsible for enforcing the scoring system;
- referee should control the timing of breaks - 1 minute for each time-out and between sets;
- referee has the authority to make decisions on any disputes or conflicts that arise during a match;
- referee is authorized to issue warnings or removings for unsportsmanlike conduct, such as verbal abuse, aggressive behavior, or improper etiquette;
- referee confirm match results and add it to the website;
- referee should report any incidents or irregularities to the organizer;
- in the event of a player injury or medical emergency, the referee has the authority to call for a medical timeout or make decisions regarding the player's ability to continue;
- referee is expected to remain neutral, impartial, and fair in all their decisions, treating all players equally, regardless of nationality, skill level, or ranking;
- if there are technical issues or problems with the playing environment the referee can stop the match;
- if a player violates important tournament rules or fails to adhere to match protocols, the referee may stop the match to enforce the rules;
- referee can also stop a match if a player is significantly underperforming, and it is determined that the player is intentionally not competing to the best of his/her ability. Referee has the discretion to issue a warning or, if the behavior persists, inform organizers and wait for the decision.

3.4. Prize money

This chapter outlines the distribution, eligibility, and regulations regarding prize money for players participating in the tournament. The purpose is to ensure transparency, fairness, and adherence to the tournament's financial policies.

- Prize money serves as a key motivation for players, recognizing their hard work, skill, and dedication to the sport;
- beyond being a financial reward, it encourages athletes to fight for every match, push their limits, perform at their best, and continuously improve;
- financial rewards help players invest in better training, equipment, and coaching;
- players strive for higher performance levels, knowing their success will be rewarded;
- there are 2 type of system:
 1. The prize money is accumulated based on each match won;
 2. Final position (place) in the tournament; the breakdown of prize money for each stage (final, semifinal etc)
- prize money will be processed within a specified period after the tournament's conclusion;
- players must provide accurate payment details;
- payments will be made via bank transfer or other approved payment methods;
- prize money may be subject to tax deductions based on local laws and regulations;
- any fines or penalties imposed due to rule violations may be deducted from the prize money;
- prize money shall be paid only for played matches and in accordance with rules and regulations established in this handbook.

4. Tournament integrity

4.1. Anti match-fixing program

The integrity of table tennis tournaments is a critical aspect to ensure fair play, transparency, and a competitive environment. TTCup.com has strict regulations against match-fixing. This includes monitoring betting patterns and ensuring players don't engage in fixing matches.

Educating players about the consequences of match-fixing and maintaining ethics within the sport is a key preventive measure. So in collaboration with the Sportradar integrity department, we have developed a platform to educate players on the importance of fair play - Table Tennis Cup Integrity Training.

This is a proactive integrity tool aimed at educating you on the topic of anti-match-fixing in table tennis.

After successfully completing the training, the player receives a certificate, signifying his/her eligibility to participate in tournaments.

There have been used real-world examples of match-fixing cases to highlight the risks involved, how it can affect the integrity of the sport, and how players can avoid being manipulated.

Players should be aware of the rules and regulations surrounding themselves and betting.

! Competition stakeholders shall not engage, nor attempt to engage, in any sports betting activity relating in any way to any Table Tennis Cup event. For clarity, competition stakeholders include competitors or players, coaches, trainers, officials, event staff or any other person associated with games or events who possesses privileged information.

- ! Also, they shall not instruct, permit, cause, or enable other individual(s) to engage, or attempt to engage, in any sports betting activity relating in any way to any Table Tennis Cup events.
- ! This rule applies to all sports betting activities including, without limitation, those available in any gambling casino, on the internet, or electronically, or in all other establishments and locations.

Match-fixing can take a number of different forms, and all forms of fixing and manipulation are prohibited and considered serious matters by the TT Cup.com.

With regards to the rules and regulations related to match fixing:

- ! Competition stakeholders may not be involved with the offering, giving, acceptance, or receipt of a bribe, gift, or any type of consideration, financial or otherwise, that could improperly influence, manipulate or “fix” any Tale Tennis Cup event in any way.
- ! Also, they are prohibited from influencing, manipulating, attempting to influence or manipulate, or requesting or instructing others to influence or manipulate any Table Tennis Cup event in any way such that the outcome or any other aspect of the event is determined by anything other than the competitor’s merits.
- ! You must play with integrity. Never get involved in any form of corruption!

Fixing is not the only threat to the integrity of the TTCup.com tournaments – the sharing of inside information is also a serious risk. Inside information is information which an individual associated with competition has obtained by virtue of his or her position within the sport – or any other non-public special knowledge or information.

- ! Competition stakeholders are prohibited from requesting or disclosing, directly or indirectly, any non-public information that could potentially provide an advantage in sports betting activities to any person that does not have a legitimate need to know such non-public information.

! Individuals may violate this provision whether they know or reasonably should know that the non-public information in question could potentially be used for the purposes of sports betting activities.

The sources of fixing are varied. There are cases where players, coaches and match officials have been found guilty of match-fixing and indeed examples of backroom staff, player's agents or even family members becoming involved. All parties must remember, match-fixing is an offence, and whilst those perpetrators might not always be your stereotypical criminal, often there are wider links to networks controlled by organised criminals.

Fixers may use various modus operandi to encourage all competition stakeholders to fix. This includes gifts, social media, criminal exploitation, fans, false friendships and even untrustworthy messages.

! To confirm, you must always report suspected, anticipated, or known violations of the Table Tennis Cup Sports Betting Policy without undue delay and unpromoted at the first available opportunity.

! You may report this activity to Table Tennis Cup manager and/or on-side Table Tennis Cup officials (integrity@tt-cup.com).

! You have a duty to report this information, whether directly involved with the matter or reasonably aware of the matter.

! Failure to report is considered an offence by the TT Cup and so if this occurs it could result in punishment.

TTcup.com detects the illicit activity by Sportradar's Fraud Detection System (FTS). The System triggers alerts which are analysed by expert sport and betting analysts who will confirm whether a reasonable explanation exists for the unusual betting activity witnessed and conclude whether a match presents overwhelming indications of manipulation for betting purposes.

Remember the three Rs:

- **Recognise** any attempt to manipulate a match or to gain a financial advantage through fraud.
- **Resist** any temptation to accept match-fixing related offers and demands, and immediately reject them under all circumstances.
- **Report** to the TTCup.com any offer of a bribe or any attempt by a person in breach of the betting, match-fixing and corruption rules and regulations.

Not knowing the rules is certainly not an excuse.

4.2. Anti-Doping policy

The anti-doping policy in table tennis aims to maintain fair play, protect athletes' health, and uphold the integrity of the sport. It aligns with the regulations set by the ITTF.

- Players are strictly prohibited from using performance-enhancing drugs and substances.
- The use of banned substances, blood doping, and other illicit performance-enhancing methods is strictly forbidden.
- Doping is fundamentally contrary to the spirit of sport.
- If a player requires a prohibited substance for medical reasons, they must apply for TTCup.com's Officials.
- Players and officials are encouraged to report any suspected doping violations.
- Maintaining a clean and fair competition is essential for the integrity of table tennis, and all players are expected to adhere to the anti-doping rules to ensure a level playing field.

4.3. Offences and sanctions

The TTCup.com's strong reputation, along with its events and players, is a valuable asset that brings tangible benefits to all its members. Therefore, all parties are required to avoid any conduct that may compromise the integrity of TTCup.com and table tennis in general.

These actions typically result in disciplinary action, which can range from temporary suspension to lifetime disqualification, depending on the severity of the offense:

- one or more instances of behavior identified in regulation as constituting disruptive conduct;
- match-fixing - engaging in or attempting to manipulate the outcome of a match through illegal means, including bribery, collusion, or betting against oneself; this also includes any actions that undermine the integrity of the competition;
- actions that damage the reputation of the tournament, officials, or the sport itself;
- deliberate disruption of matches, excessive protests, or disrespectful gestures;
- repeated code violation, as persistently disregarding rules, ignoring referee warnings, or continuously engaging in misconduct;
- publicised comments that unreasonably attack or disparage any person or group of people, an event, partner, player, Official, or the Tournament; or public remarks that any of the aforementioned individuals know, or should reasonably know, are specifically addressed by this rule;
- the sharing of inside information - privileged information could be related to player injury or health, personal circumstances which could affect an individual's performance (such as a family bereavement), tactical plans, or other line-up information or news;
- involvement in illegal activities, including criminal behavior; charged with violating criminal or civil laws in any jurisdiction.

The sanction has been made clear and public, ensuring that all players understand the severe consequences of violating the rules.

Players found guilty of match-fixing should face severe sanctions, including suspension, fines, and permanent disqualification from TTCup.com tournaments.

Investigation:

- if it deems appropriate, the Organiser may refer any alleged breach of this regulation to the Sportradar Integrity Unit for investigation or prosecution, according to the principles and procedures set out in the ITTF Statutes, and the Covered Persons accepts the authority of the Sportradar Integrity Unit as set out thereunder. Notwithstanding this, the Sportradar Integrity Unit may, at its discretion, commence an investigation or prosecution of any alleged breach of this regulation;
- if a player is deemed suspicious, he/she will be suspended from tournament participation for the period of the investigation.

Consequences for a table tennis player due to conduct contrary to the integrity of the sport may include:

- reputational – official statements or warnings issued, publicly denouncing the player's behavior and reinforcing the consequences of their actions; will significantly damage your own long-term brand and image in the public eye and within the industry;
- financial – a player may face reduced tournament prize money, as a regular income; particularly if he/she is banned from major events or if he/she actions lead to a diminished career trajectory; removal from partnerships with sponsors, companies, or brands who wish to disassociate from the misconduct.
- personal – players may experience significant personal stress, anxiety, and emotional strain due to the public scrutiny, media coverage, and the impact of their actions on their personal life; potential stress due to criminal intimidation and family anguish.

Suspensions of the participation will be provided in most cases to save and protect the reputation of the TTCup.com - for a minimum period of investigation process and a maximum period - forever.

A player who is permanently suspended from a table tennis tournament faces a ban that is meant to be lifelong and final. This means the individual will never be allowed to participate in any future tournaments under the TTCup.com.

The fees or penalties for offences under this regulation may be issued by the Organiser according to the agreement the player has signed.

Payments of fines by any player for any violation of this regulation shall be deducted from the player's prize money, if any.

These penalties and effects aim to maintain the integrity of table tennis, promote fair play, and safeguard the reputation of the sport while acknowledging the personal and emotional toll such misconduct can have on the player and their close connections.
